**Current Law:**

- Chapter 94 of the Massachusetts General Laws pertains to the inspection and sale of food, drugs, and various articles

**Summary:**

This bill requires manufacturers to put a clear list of ingredients on the packaging of all menstrual products and to change the labeling on a product when ingredients are changed or added. This bill also requires manufacturers to post ingredient information online for a product manufactured for sale or distribution in Massachusetts.

**SECTION 1**

- (a) defines the terms “ingredient,” “menstrual product,” and “manufacturer.”
- (b) requires manufacturers to put a clear list of ingredients on the packaging of all menstrual products manufactured for sale or distribution in the Commonwealth.
- (c) requires manufacturers to change the labeling on a product when ingredients are changed or added.
- (d) requires manufacturers of any menstrual product manufactured for sale or distribution in Massachusetts to post on an internet website the same ingredient information required on the packaging of the product.
- (e) requires manufacturers to revise information disclosed online when an ingredient is changed or added.
- (f) states that these requirements shall apply in addition to any other labeling requirements already established in the MGL.
- (g) creates a fine of \$1,000 for violations of this section.

SECTION 2 states that this act shall take effect 12 months after passage.
