

place of residence, unless secured by a lock.

- Increases the existing possession threshold at which a person will be subject to only a civil penalty, from 2 to 3 ounces of marijuana for a person over the age of 21 outside of the person's residence.
- Increases the existing possession threshold at which a person under the age of 21 will be subject to only a civil penalty for possession.
- Increases the number of marijuana retail licenses permitted to be held by a single licensee from 3 to 4.
- Increases the equity threshold to establish ownership of a marijuana license from 10 to 12 per cent.
- Instructs the Cannabis Control Commission to create a delinquent list for licensees who do not discharge indebtedness within a 60 day period.
- Prohibits a licensee from selling or delivering, directly or indirectly, marijuana or marijuana products to a licensee whose name is posted on the delinquent list.
- Prohibits a change of ownership or control of a licensee on the delinquent list until all delinquencies are satisfied and the Commission has removed the licensee from the delinquent list.
- Allows an individual who possesses a valid patient registration for medical use marijuana issued by a jurisdiction of the United States to purchase medical marijuana at a medical marijuana establishment in the Commonwealth.
- Removes the requirement that medical use marijuana licensees simultaneously cultivate, process and dispense medical use marijuana as a condition of obtaining or maintaining licensure to operate a medical marijuana establishment.
- Requires the Cannabis Control Commission to study and report on the mental health outcomes of cannabis use in the Commonwealth not later than January 1, 2027.
