Cape Verdean Commission — Preliminary Meeting Minutes

1) Call to Order & Recording

 Meeting opened at 12:00 PM by Sen. Liz Miranda; Rashelle Centeio (Sen. Miranda's office) initiated recording and facilitated logistics.

3) Opening Context & Mandate

• **History:** Seven-year effort originating in the House (initially advanced by former Rep. Evandro Carvalho; early bond-bill earmark).

- Purpose: Statutory feasibility study for establishing a Massachusetts Cabo Verdean Cultural Center in Boston.
- **Funding:** Seed appropriation referenced (approx. **\$75,000–\$100,000**; exact figure to be confirmed).
- Timeline: Aim to produce a report within one year; meet monthly or quarterly (to be set).
- Commonwealth-wide lens: While sited in Boston, the Center is envisioned as a statewide hub with strong ties to New Bedford, Cape Cod/Falmouth, Brockton, Taunton, etc. Parallel cultural-center efforts in New Bedford noted.

4) Membership Structure (per statute)

• Voting members:

- 3 Senators (Senate President appointees; districts with significant Cape Verdean population)
- 1 Senator (Senate Minority Leader appointee)
 - 3 Representatives (Speaker appointees; districts with significant Cape Verdean population)
- 1 Representative (House Minority Leader appointee)
- 1 Mayor of Boston appointee
- 1 Governor appointee
- Leadership: Commission elects 2 co-chairs from among members.
- Expansion: With majority approval, co-chairs may add up to 15 additional members (residing in/representing municipalities with significant Cape Verdean residents/heritage).

5) Discussion — Leadership (Co-Chairs)

- Options discussed:
 - 1. Legislative co-chairs (one House + one Senate).
 - 2. Executive appointee co-chairs (Governor + Mayor appointees).
 - 3. **Hybrid** (one legislator + one executive appointee).
- Open Meeting Law/process: Rep. Cabral emphasized adherence to public-meeting procedures (posting, agendas, minutes). Offered some staff support from his office to help with compliance and coordination.
- Interest: Rep. Diggs expressed interest but flagged capacity limits; open to robust participation even if not serving as co-chair. Monica Veiga open to a hybrid model.

6) Composition Priorities for Additional Members

- Seek breadth across arts, culture, music, education, history, community building, philanthropy, and building/development expertise.
- Prioritize **Boston** affiliation **and** ensure **regional** and **gender** diversity.

 Consider forming an external advisory group of presidents/leads from Cape Verdean associations statewide to ensure broad input without over-weighting membership.

8) Motions & Actions

- 1. Motion: Reconvene in two weeks to:
