## **CURRENT LAW:**

Section 94 of chapter 93 establishes that a contract between a propane dealer and a property owner shall not be binding upon a subsequent purchaser of said property.

## **SUMMARY:**

This bill requires that any contract or agreement for the sale of propane must be in writing and contain all terms and conditions for delivery and the amount of fees, charges, surcharges or penalties. Any contract that includes an automatic renewal clause must allow the consumer to terminate at the end of the initial term or subsequent anniversary date with 30 days written notice. A propane dealer must clearly and conspicuously post their daily propane delivery price for residential customers, including its website.
