## Massachusetts House of Representatives Bill Summary

**Bill #**: H.4400

**Title:** An Act relative to the charter of the city known as the town of Randolph

**Sponsor**: Rep. Richard Wells

**Committee:** Joint Committee on Municipalities and Regional Government

**Hearing Date:** September 4 to September 11, 2025 written testimony hearing

## **Current Law:**

Section 2-4(a) of the Randolph charter states that the town council shall serve without compensation.

Section 4-1(e) states that members of the school committee may be imbursed for expenses but makes no mention of compensation.

Section 2-9(b) states that if a member of the town council postpones a vote during a meeting of the town council, it may be taken up after a period of at least five days.

## Summary:

<u>Section 1</u> edits Section 2-4(a) of the Randolph charter by adding language allowing for compensation to the town council as provided by ordinance.

<u>Section 2</u> amends Section 4-1(e) by adding language allowing for compensation to the school committee as provided by ordinance.

<u>Section 3</u> changes Section 2-9(b) by decreasing the amount of time a matter may be taken up by the city council after having been previously postponed by a member of the council from five to four days.

<u>Section 4</u> amends Section 2-6(c)(ii) by requiring a 48 hours' notice before a special meeting of the town council.

<u>Section 5</u> edits Section 8-6(a) by expanding said 48-hour notice for special meetings to all town boards.

<u>Section 6</u> states that the content of this act shall be placed as a ballot question onto the ballot of the next regular election that is more than 35 days after the effective date of this act, with a summary prepared by the town attorney.

<u>Section 7</u> states that if the ballot question is approved, sections 1 through 5 shall take effect. If it is not approved, the same sections shall not take effect.

<u>Section 8</u> states that sections 1 through 5 shall take effect on January 1, 2026, or upon passage. Sections 6 through 8 shall take effect upon passage.
