CURRENT LAW:

Chapter 260 of the Acts of 2020 §75 An Act promoting a resilient health care system that puts patients first

The Act imposes new requirements on providers and health plans regarding telehealth, balance billing, and coverage for COVID-19 related services. The Act uses the terms "provider" and "health care provider," without specifically defining them.

Chapter 260 of the Acts of 2020 §25 An Act promoting a resilient health care system that puts patients first

(f) The commissioner will implement this section and impose penalties for non-compliance consistent with the department's authority to regulate health care providers; provided, however, that the penalty for non-compliance shall not exceed \$2,500 in each instance. A health care provider that violates any provision of this section or the rules and regulations adopted pursuant to this subsection shall be liable for penalties as provided in this subsection.

Chapter 22 Acts of 2022, An Act making appropriations for the fiscal year 2022 to provide for supplementing certain existing appropriations and for certain other activities and projects § 3 Section 75 of chapter 260 of the acts of 2020 is hereby amended by striking out the words "January 1" and inserting in place thereof the following words: - July 31.

Chapter 107 of the Acts of 2022, An Act relative to extending certain state of emergency accommodations § 2

Section 75 of chapter 260 of the acts of 2020, as amended by section 3 of chapter 22 of the acts of 2022, is hereby further amended by striking out the words "July 31, 2022" and inserting in place thereof the following words: - January 1, 2025.

SUMMARY:

The bill intends to amend the general laws so that the provisions of *Chapter 260 of the Acts of 2020* that refer to "health care provider" do not apply to any provider licensed to practice dentistry.
