**CURRENT LAW:**

Section 4 of Chapter 94G of the Massachusetts General Laws requires the Cannabis Control Commission (CCC) to promulgate regulations containing requirements for potency or dosing limitations of edible marijuana products.

**SUMMARY:**

H.191 amends Section 4 of Chapter 94G to require the CCC to promulgate THC potency limits that at minimum prohibit flower with potency greater than 30% THC, concentrates that exceed 5mg THC per serving or with potency greater than 30% THC, packages of marijuana concentrate exceeding 20 servings of 5mgs of THC, and liquid marijuana products exceeding 5mg THC. It further requires prohibition on marijuana products with added sweeteners, inhalable cannabinoid products with characterizing flavors or containing non-cannabis derived substances, and components to strengthen the intoxicating effect of any marijuana product.
