CURRENT LAW

Section 13A of Chapter 21A of the Massachusetts General Laws governs system inspectors of on-site sewage disposal systems and prohibits any inspector from recommending to a property owner any specific disposal system installer, including themself. Each local board of health shall prepare and make available for inspectors to provide a list of installers (which may contain but may not distinguish such inspector). Violations shall be punished by an up to \$1,000 fine.

SUMMARY

This legislation seeks to require that a system inspector who performs an onsite inspection of a sewage disposal to take photographs as part of the inspection process. Fines for violations of this section shall include \$1,000 for first offense, \$2,000 and 3-month license suspension for second offense, and license revocation for third offense. Systems inspections shall be notified by the department of environmental protection of these requirements.
