PRIOR HISTORY

(2023-2024): H3893 – Bill reported favorably by Committee and referred to House Steering, Policy and Scheduling; Ordered to a third reading.

CURRENT LAW

Section 185I of Chapter 140 of the General Laws governs the license application process, fees, and fines for violations relative to the practice of fortune telling; and prohibits the telling of fortunes for money without a local, non-transferable license. Applicants for a license must reside in the municipality where the license is sought for a continuous 12-month period prior to application submission.

SUMMARY

This legislation seeks to remove the residency requirement for a fortune teller's license, which currently requires that fortune tellers live in the city or town they practice in.
