Resolutions (filed by Mr. Wallace of Boston and other members of the House) congratulating Ambassador Raymond L. Flynn on his selection as Grand Marshal of the 2007 St. Patrick's Day Parade;

Mr. Scaccia of Boston, for the committee on Rules, reported, in each instance, that the resolutions ought to be adopted. Under suspension of the rules, in each instance, on motion of Mr. Fagan of Taunton, the resolutions (reported by the committee on Bills in the Third Reading to be correctly drawn) were considered forthwith; and they were adopted.

Reports of Committees.

By Mr. DeLeo of Winthrop, for the committee on Ways and Means, that the Bill releasing a non-development covenant restriction on certain land in the town of Leicester (House, No. 19) ought to pass with an amendment by adding the following section: Leicester,—
development.

“SECTION 4. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary the non-development agreement referenced in sections 1 and 2 of this act shall remain in full force and effect except for parcels released from said non-development agreement pursuant to said sections 1 and 2 of this act.”. Referred, under Rule 7A, to the committee on Steering, Policy and Scheduling.

Mr. Donato of Medford, for said committee, reported that the matter be scheduled for consideration by the House.

Under suspension of Rule 7A, on motion of the same member, the bill was read a second time forthwith.

The amendment recommended by the committee on Ways and Means then was adopted; and the bill House, No. 19, amended) was ordered to a third reading.

Engrossed Bills.

The engrossed Bill establishing a sick leave bank for Cheryl L. Traina, an employee of the Department of Revenue (see House, No. 3744) (which originated in the House), in respect to which the Senate had concurred in adoption of the emergency preamble, was passed to be enacted; and it was signed by the acting Speaker and sent to the Senate. The engrossed Bill relative to the modernization of registries of deeds (see House, No. 3751) (which originated in the House) (which had been returned by His Excellency the Governor with recommendation of amendment), having been certified by the Clerk to be rightly and truly prepared for final passage, was passed to be re-enacted, in its amended form; and it was signed by the acting Speaker and sent to the Senate. re-enacted.
