Motions to Discharge Certain Matters in the Orders of the Day.

Suicide, study. Mr. Walsh of Boston moved that the House Bill relative to the study on methods to reduce incidents of suicide (House, No. 2165), be discharged from its position in the Orders of the Day and considered forthwith, under suspension of Rule 47; and the motion prevailed.

The bill then was read a third time.

The committee on Bills in the Third Reading reported recommending that the bill be amended by substitution of a Resolve providing for an investigation and study by a special commission relative to suicide prevention (House, No. 5084), which was read.

The amendment was adopted; and the substituted resolve was passed to be engrossed. Sent to the Senate for concurrence.

Boston, polling places. Mr. Sánchez of Boston moved that the House Bill relative to polling places in the city of Boston (House, No. 4983), be discharged from its position in the Orders of the Day and considered forthwith, under suspension of Rule 47; and the motion prevailed.

The bill (its title having been changed by the committee on Bills in the Third Reading), reported by said committee to be correctly drawn, then was read a third time; and it was passed to be engrossed. Sent to the Senate for concurrence.
