Reports of Committees.

Transportation reform bill,— procedures.

Mr. Binienda of Worcester, for the committee on Rules, reported (under the provisions of House Rules 7B and 7C) an Order relative to special procedures for consideration of the Senate Bill providing responsible reforms in the pension system (Senate, No. 2026) (for order, see House, No. 4053); and the order was adopted.

Emergency Measure.

Motor vehicle insurance charges.

The engrossed Bill relative to an appeal process of insurance premium surcharges under managed competition (see Senate, No. 2022, amended) having been certified by the Clerk to be rightly and truly prepared for final passage, was considered, the question being on adopting the emergency preamble.

A separate vote was taken, as required by the provisions of Article XLVIII (as amended by Article LXVII) of the Amendments to the Constitution; and the preamble was adopted, by a vote of 4 to 0. Sent
