By Mr. Binienda of Worcester, for the committee on Rules, on a message from His Excellency the Governor, a Bill validating the results of the annual town meeting of the town of Medfield held on April 29, 2013 (House, No. 3500). Read; and referred, under Rule 7A, to the committee on Steering, Policy and Scheduling.

Under suspension of Rule 7A, on motion of Mr. Kafka of Stoughton, the bill was read a second time forthwith; and it was ordered to a third reading.

Subsequently under suspension of the rules, on motion of Ms. Garlick of Needham, the bill (reported by the committee on Bills in the Third Reading to be correctly drawn) was read a third time; and it was passed to be engrossed. Sent to the Senate for concurrence.

Oxford,—incorporation.

By Ms. Peake of Provincetown, for the committee on Municipalities and Regional Government, on a message from His Excellency the

Governor, a Bill validating the date of incorporation of the town of Oxford (printed in House, No. 3465).

By the same member, for the same committee, on a petition, a Bill relative to a conservation restriction in the town of Stow (House, No. 3474) [Local Approval Received].

Under suspension of Rule 7A, in each instance, on motion of Mr. Kafka, the bills severally were read a second time forthwith; and they were ordered to a third reading.

Emergency Measure.

The engrossed Bill relative to the terms of certain bonds issued by the Commonwealth (see House, No. 3488), having been certified by the Clerk to be rightly and truly prepared for final passage, was considered, the question being on adopting the emergency preamble.

Transportation.

A separate vote was taken, as required by the provisions of Article XLVIII (as amended by Article LXVII) of the Amendments to the Constitution; and the preamble was adopted, by a vote of 6 to 0. Sent to the Senate for concurrence.

Subsequently, the Senate having concurred in adoption of the emergency preamble, the bill (which originated in the House) was passed enacted. to be enacted; and it was signed by the acting Speaker and sent to the Senate.
