Joint Rule 12 was suspended; and the petition (accompanied by bill) was referred to the committee on State Administration and Regulatory Oversight. Sent to the Senate for concurrence.

McGee for legislation to establish a sick leave bank for Rose Britton, an employee of the Trial Court; and the same was referred, under Rule 24, to the committee on Rules.

Plum Island, tax abatement. A petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 1788) of Bruce E. Tarr and Leonard Mirra (by vote of the town) for legislation to authorize the board of assessors of the town of Newbury to grant an abatement of real estate taxes to certain Plum Island home owners for fiscal year 2013, was referred, in concurrence, to the committee on Revenue.

By the same member, for the same committee, on a petition, a Bill establishing a revolving fund for municipal building repair (House, No. 174).

Food trust,—establish.

By the same member, for the same committee, on House, No. 168, a Bill to expand access to healthy foods and create the Massachusetts Food Trust (House, No. 3504).
