The amendments were adopted.
Mr. Wagner of Chicopee then moved to amend the bill by inserting before the enacting clause the following emergency preamble:
"Whereas, The deferred operation of this act would tend to defeat its purpose, which is to make forthwith certain statutory changes to the uniform commercial code, therefore it is hereby declared to be an emergency law, necessary for the immediate preservation of the public convenience.".

The amendment was adopted.
After remarks on the question on passing the bill, as amended, to be engrossed, the sense of the House was take by yeas and nays at the request of Mr. Wagner of Chicopee; and on the roll call 152 members voted in the affirmative and 0 in the negative.

Therefore the bill (House, No. 28, amended) was passed to be engrossed. Sent to the Senate for concurrence.
