Orders of the Day.

The House Bill providing the terms for certain bonds financing the expansion of the Boston Convention and Exhibition Center (House, No. 4444), reported by the committee on Bills in the Third Reading to be correctly drawn, was read a third time; and it was passed to be engrossed. Sent to the Senate for concurrence.

The House Bill authorizing the town of Mansfield to grant additional liquor licenses (House, No. 4413), reported by the committee on Bills in the Third Reading to be correctly drawn, was read a third time.

Pending the question on passing the bill to be engrossed, Mr. Barrows of Mansfield moved to amend it in section 1, in lines 21, 22 and 23, by striking out the sentence contained in those lines and inserting in place thereof the following sentence: "The licensing authority shall not approve the transfer of a license granted pursuant to this act to: (i) any other person, corporation, partnership or organization for a period of 3 years from the date of original issuance; or (ii) a location outside of the areas identified in this act where the license was originally granted.".

The amendment was adopted; and the bill, as amended, was passed to be engrossed. The bill (House, No. 4413, amended) then was sent to the Senate for concurrence.
