Athletic coaches,— CPR. The Senate Bill relative to cardiopulmonary resuscitation certification for athletic coaches (Senate, No. 1918), reported by the committee on Bills in the Third Reading to be correctly drawn, was read a third time.

Pending the question on passing the bill to be engrossed, in concurrence, Mr. Speliotis of Danvers moved to amend it by striking out section 2 and inserting in place thereof the following section:

"SECTION 2. This act shall take effect on August 1, 2015.".

The amendment was adopted; and the bill (Senate, No. 1918, amended) was passed to be engrossed, in concurrence. Sent to the Senate for concurrence in the amendment.
