Tuesday, November 12, 2013.

Met according to adjournment at eleven o'clock A.M., in an Informal Session, with Mr. Donato of Medford in the Chair (having been appointed by the Speaker, under authority conferred by Rule 5, to perform the duties of the Chair).

Pledge of allegiance.

At the request of the Chair (Mr. Donato) the members, guests and employees joined with him in reciting the pledge of allegiance to the flag.

Resolutions.

Chanukah.

Resolutions (filed with the Clerk by Mr. Smizik of Brookline and other members of the House) commemorating the celebration of Chanukah 2013, were referred, under Rule 85, to the committee on Rules.

Mr. Binienda of Worcester, for said committee, reported that the resolutions ought to be adopted. Under suspension of the rules, on motion of Mr. Smizik, the resolutions (reported by the committee on Bills in the Third Reading to be correctly drawn) were considered forthwith; and they were adopted.

Petition.

Flood insurance.

By Mr. DeLeo of Winthrop, a petition (subject to Joint Rule 12) of Robert A. DeLeo, Martha Coakley (Attorney General) and others relative to the requirement of residential property owners to purchase or pay for flood insurance; and the same was referred, under Rule 24, to the committee on Rules.

Papers from the Senate.

Wales, recall elections. The House Bill providing for recall elections in the town of Wales (House, No. 641), came from the Senate passed to be engrossed, in concurrence, with amendments in section 2, in line 3, by inserting after the word "voters" the words "of the town of Wales"; in section 3, in line 24, by inserting after the word "certificate" the words ", either by hand or certified mail, return receipt requested", and in section 5, in line 41, by inserting after the word "election" the words "either by hand or certified mail, return receipt requested".

The amendments were referred, under Rule 35, to the committee on Bills in the Third Reading.

Ludlow, property lease. The Senate Bill authorizing the lease of certain property in the town of Ludlow (Senate, No. 1769, changed in section 1, in line 1, by striking out the following: "section 16 of chapter 30B of the General Laws or", and, in line 2, by inserting after the word "contrary" the following: "but the subject to paragraphs (a), (b) and (g) of section 16 of chapter 30B of the General Laws") [Local Approval Received], passed to be engrossed by the Senate, was read; and it was referred, under Rule 7A, to the committee on Steering, Policy and Scheduling.

Mr. Kafka of Stoughton, for said committee, then reported that the bill be scheduled for consideration by the House; and, under said rule, it was placed in the Orders of the Day for the next sitting for a second reading.

The Senate Bill relative to the town clerk in the town of Upton (Senate, No. 1855) [Local Approval Received]; passed to be engrossed by the Senate, was read; and it was referred, under Rule 7A, to the committee on Steering, Policy and Scheduling.

The House Bill relative to pharmacy practice in the Commonwealth (House, No. 3672, amended), came from the Senate with the endorsement that said branch had insisted on its amendments (striking out all after the enacting clause and inserting in place thereof the text contained in Senate document numbered 1907; and inserting before the enacting clause an emergency preamble) (in which the House had nonconcurred).

Pharmacv practice.

The bill bore the further endorsement that said branch had concurred with the House in the appointment of a committee of conference on the disagreeing votes of the two branches; and that Senators Keenan, Brewer and Tarr had been joined as the committee on the part of the Senate.

By Mr. Murphy of Weymouth, for the committee on Election Laws, on a message from His Excellency the Governor, a Bill validating the results of the annual election held in the town of Ipswich on May 21, 2013 (printed in House, No. 3717).

By Mr. Straus of Mattapoisett, for the committee on Transportation, on a petition, a Bill designating a certain overpass in the town of Barnstable as the U.S. Navy SEAL Kevin A. Houston Veterans Memorial (House, No. 3101).

Read; and referred, under Rule 7A, to the committee on Steering, Policy and Scheduling.

Mr. Kafka of Stoughton, for said committee, then reported that the matter be scheduled for consideration by the House; and, under said rule, it was placed in the Orders of the Day for the next sitting for a second reading.

Flexible supports oversight commission.

By Mr. Kafka of Stoughton, for the committee on Steering, Policy and Scheduling, that the House Bill relative to creating a community based flexible supports oversight commission (House, No. 1805, changed), be scheduled for consideration by the House.

Placed in the Orders of the Day for the next sitting for a second reading, with an amendment previously recommended by the committee on Health Care Financing,—that the bill be amended by substitution of a bill with the same title (House, No. 3710),—pending.

Psychologists,—training.

By Mr. Kafka of Stoughton, for the committee on Steering, Policy and Scheduling, that the House Bill relative to acceptable health service training for psychologists (House, No. 1893), be scheduled for consideration by the House.

Placed in the Orders of the Day for the next sitting for a second reading, with an amendment previously recommended by the committee on Health Care Financing,—that the bill be amended by substitution of a bill with the same title (House, No. 3731),—pending.

By Mr. Kafka of Stoughton, for the committee on Steering, Policy and Scheduling, that the following House bills be scheduled for consideration by the House:

Severally reported by the committee on Bills in the Third Reading to be correctly drawn, were read a third time; and they were passed to be engrossed, in concurrence.

The House Bill establishing a sick leave bank for Anne Fiesinger, an Anne employee of the Department of Conservation and Recreation (House, No. 3725), reported by the committee on Bills in the Third Reading to be correctly drawn, was read a third time.

Pending the question on passing the bill to be engrossed, Mr. Livingstone of Boston moved to amend it by inserting before the enacting clause the following emergency preamble:

"Whereas, The deferred operation of this act would tend to defeat its purpose, which is to establish forthwith a sick leave bank for a certain employee of the department of conservation and recreation, therefore it is hereby declared to be an emergency law, necessary for the immediate preservation of the public convenience.".

The amendment was adopted; and the bill (House, No. 3725, amended) was passed to be engrossed. Sent to the Senate for concurrence.
