Resolutions.

Resolutions (filed with the Clerk by Mr. Arciero of Westford) honoring Lieutenant Hervey Philip Cote on his retirement from the Westford Police Department, were referred, under Rule 85, to the committee on Rules.

Ms. Hogan of Stow, for said committee, reported that the resolutions ought to be adopted. Under suspension of the rules on motion of Mr. Wong of Saugus, the resolutions (reported by the committee on Bills in the Third Reading to be correctly drawn) were considered forthwith; and they were adopted.

Papers from the Senate.

The House Bill establishing a Mystic River watershed water quality commission (House, No. 4302), came from the Senate passed to be engrossed, in concurrence, with an amendment striking out all after the enacting clause and inserting in place thereof the text contained in Senate document numbered 2399. The amendment was referred, under Rule 35, to the committee on Bills in the Third Reading.

A Bill establishing a commission on the status of children and youth (Senate, No. 2398) (on Senate bill No. 2080), passed to be engrossed by the Senate, was read; and it was referred, under Rule 33, to the committee on Ways and Means.

A petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 2397) of Brian A. Joyce, Mark J. Cusack, Bruce J. Ayers and Walter F. Timilty (by vote of the town) for legislation to authorize the town of Randolph to designate a check-off on its tax bills, was referred, in concurrence, to the committee on Revenue.

The House Bill amending the Bourne home rule charter (House, No. 4477), was read a third time.

The committee on Bills in the Third Reading reported recommending that the bill be amended by substitution of a bill with the same title (House, No. 4538), which was read.

The amendment was adopted; and the substituted bill was passed to be engrossed. Sent to the Senate for concurrence.
