By Mr. Sánchez of Boston, for the committee on Public Health, on Senate, No. 1023 and House, No. 1887, a Bill relative to concussion prevention (House, No. 3806).

Belmont, liquor licenses. Authorizing the town of Belmont to grant licenses for the sale of wines and malt beverages to be drunk on the premises (House, No. 3780) [Local Approval Received]; and

Stoneham, liquor licenses. Authorizing the town of Stoneham to grant five additional special liquor licenses for the sale of wines and malt beverages to be drunk on the premises (House, No. 3786) [Local Approval Received];

Under suspension of Rule 7Å, in each instance, on motion of the same member, the bills severally were read a second time forthwith; and they were ordered to a third reading.
