Resolutions.

Kenneth LaChapelle. Resolutions (filed by Mr. Muradian of Grafton) recognizing Northbridge High School football coach Kenneth LaChapelle for becoming the winningest high school football coach in Massachusetts history; and

Thirteenth Amendment. Resolutions (filed by Ms. Story of Amherst) commemorating the one hundred and fiftieth anniversary of the ratification of the Thirteenth Amendment;
