### *Message from the Governor — Bill Returned with Recommendation of Amendment.*

Newton,—

charter.

A message from His Excellency the Governor returning with recommendation of amendment the engrossed Bill relative to the charter of the city of Newton [see House, No. 3563, amended] (for message, see House, No. 3752), was filed in the office of the Clerk on Thursday, September 3.

The message was read; and, under the provisions of Article LVI of the Amendments to the Constitution, the bill was thereupon “before the General Court and subject to amendment and re-enactment”.

Pending the question on adoption of the amendment recommended by His Excellency, the bill was referred, on motion of Mr. Speliotis of Danvers, to the committee on Bills in the Third Reading.

Resolutions (filed with the Clerk by Mr. Arciero of Westford) congratulating the Friends of the Littleton Council on Aging on the occasion of its twenty-fifth anniversary, were referred, under Rule 85, to the committee on Rules.

A Bill regulating preliminary elections in the city of Gloucester (Senate, No. 45) (on a petition) [Local Approval Received], passed to be engrossed by the Senate, was read; and it was referred, under Rule 7A, to the committee on Steering, Policy and Scheduling.

By Mr. Galvin of Canton, for the committee on Rules and the committees on Rules of the two branches, acting concurrently, that Joint Rule 12 be suspended on the joint petition of John C. Velis and Donald F. Humason, Jr., for legislation to establish a sick leave bank for Erica Amoako, an employee of the Department of Developmental Services. Under suspension of the rules, on motion of Mr. Day of Stoneham, the report was considered forthwith.
