This book was read in Alabama by a woman named Kate Keller whose daughter Helen contracted a fever at age 18 months, leaving the little girl blind and deaf.

Perkins School graduate, Annie Sullivan was sent to tutor Helen Keller. Eventually the pair lived and studied together here at the Watertown campus. Helen Keller went on to become one of the 20th century's most inspiring persons.

We give thanks for this pioneering institution and for its many alumni, as well as its current educators and students.

May God continue to bless our Commonwealth.
