The House then concurred with the Senate in the suspension of said

rule; and the petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 2116) was referred, in concurrence, to the committee on Public Service.

Reports of Committees.

By Mr. Galvin of Canton, for the committee on Rules and the committees on Rules of the two branches, acting concurrently, that Joint Rule 12 be suspended on the joint petition of Paul A. Schmid, III and Michael J. Rodrigues for legislation to designate a portion of Route 88 in the town of Westport as Governor Cellucci circle. Under suspension of the rules, on motion of Mr. Smizik of Brookline, the report was considered forthwith. Joint Rule 12 was suspended; and the petition (accompanied by bill) was referred to the committee on Transportation. Sent to the Senate for concurrence.

Westport,— Cellucci circle.

By Mr. Galvin of Canton, for the committee on Rules and the committees on Rules of the two branches, acting concurrently, that Joint land. Rule 12 be suspended on the petition of James R. Miceli for legislation to authorize the Division of Capital Asset Management and Mainte-nance to convey a certain parcel of land in the town of Tewksbury. Under suspension of the rules, on motion of Mr. Wong of Saugus, the report was considered forthwith. Joint Rule 12 was suspended; and the petition (accompanied by bill) was referred to the committee on State Administration and Regulatory Oversight. Sent to the Senate for concurrence.

By Mr. Murphy of Weymouth, for the committee on Steering, Policy and Scheduling, that the House Bill establishing a sick leave bank for Edward Gates, an employee of the Department of Environmental Protection (House, No. 3796), be scheduled for consideration by the House.

Under suspension of Rule 7A, on motion of Mr. Wong of Saugus, the bill was read a second time forthwith; and it was ordered to a third

Subsequently, under suspension of the rules, on motion of Mr. Smizik of Brookline, the bill (having been reported by the committee on Bills in the Third Reading to be correctly drawn) was read a third time.

Edward Gates,— sick leave.

Pending the question on passing the bill to be engrossed, Mr. Kafka of Stoughton moved to amend it by inserting before the enacting clause the following emergency preamble:

"Whereas, The deferred operation of this act would tend to defeat its purpose, which is to establish forthwith a sick leave bank for a certain employee of the department of environmental protection, therefore it is hereby declared to be an emergency law, necessary for the immediate preservation of the public convenience.

The amendment was adopted; and the bill (House, No. 3796, amended) was passed to be engrossed. Sent to the Senate for concurrence.

Linda Boudria,— sick leave.

By Mr. Murphy of Weymouth, for the committee on Steering, Policy and Scheduling, that the House Bill establishing a sick leave bank for Linda Boudria, an employee of the Department of Mental Health (House, No. 3795), be scheduled for consideration by the House. Under suspension of Rule 7A, on motion of Mr. Kafka of Stoughton,

the bill was read a second time forthwith; and it was ordered to a third

Severally reported by the committee on Bills in the Third Reading to be correctly drawn, were read a third time; and they were passed to be engrossed, in concurrence.

The House Bill directing the police department of the city of Boston to waive the maximum age requirement for police officers for James Anthony Verderico, Jr. (House, No. 3727) (its title having been changed by the committee on Bills in the Third Reading), reported by said committee to be correctly drawn, was read a third time; and it was passed to be engrossed. Sent to the Senate for concurrence.

The engrossed Bill establishing a sick leave bank for Gail Weinberg-Kraus, an employee of the Trial Court of the Commonwealth (see Weinberg-Kraus) Senate, No. 2044) having been certified by the Clerk to be rightly and

A separate vote was taken, as required by the provisions of Article XLVIII (as amended by Article LXVII) of the Amendments to the Constitution; and the preamble was adopted, by a vote of 2 to 0. Sent to the Senate for concurrence.

Engrossed Bill.

The engrossed Bill authorizing the town of Warren to continue the employment of Dennis Desrosiers (see Senate, No. 1420) (which original enactions) nated in the Senate), having been certified by the Clerk to be rightly and truly prepared for final passage, was passed to be enacted; and it was signed by the acting Speaker and sent to the Senate.
