Papers from the Senate.

The House Bill providing for immediate capital improvement needs Capital of the Commonwealth (House, No. 4015, amended), came from the Senate passed to be engrossed, in concurrence, with an amendment adding the following section: "SECTION 5. The division of capital asset management and main-

tenance, in consultation with the department of veterans' services, shall study the long-term capital and deferred maintenance needs of the Sol-diers' Home in Holyoke. The division shall report its findings, including requests for operating and capital expenditures, to the executive office for administration and finance, the house and senate committees on bonding, capital expenditures and state assets, the joint committee on veterans and federal affairs, and the house and senate committees on ways and means, not later than April 30, 2018."

The amendment was referred, under Rule 35, to the committee on Bills in the Third Reading.
