Severally passed to be engrossed by the Senate, were read; and they were referred, under Rule 7A, to the committee on Steering, Policy and Scheduling.

Reports of Committees.

By Mr. Cusack of Braintree, for the committee on Revenue, on Senate, No. 2659 and House, Nos. 4516, 4634, 4726, 4727, 4728 and 4760, an Order relative to authorizing the committee on Revenue to make an investigation and study of certain Senate and House documents concerning local affordable housing surcharge, stimulus checks, extending the deadline for collection of certain taxes during COVID-19 and tax exemptions for face coverings (House, No. 5109) [Senators Brady and Fattman and Representative Domb of Amherst dissenting]. Referred, under Joint Rule 29, to the committees on Rules of the two branches, acting concurrently.

Subsequently, Mr. Galvin of Canton, for said committees, reported asking to be discharged from further consideration of the order; and recommending that the same be referred to the House committee on Rules.

Housing surcharge, stimulus checks, etc.,—study.

Under Rule 42, the report was considered forthwith; and it was accepted.

By Mr. Mahoney of Worcester, for the committee on Public Health, on a petition, a Bill relative to accelerating improvements to the local and regional public health system to address disparities in the delivery of public health services (House, No. 5045). Referred, under Joint Rule 1E, to the committee on Health Care Financing.

By Mr. Cusack of Braintree, for the committee on Revenue, on a petition, a Bill authorizing the town of Saugus to designate a check-off box on it's [sic] municipal tax bills or motor vehicle excise tax bills for the Saugus Emergency Relief Fund (House, No. 5049) [Local Approval Received]. Read; and referred, under Rule 7A, to the committee on Steering, Policy and Scheduling.
