Thursday, December 3, 2020.

Met according to adjournment at eleven o'clock A.M., in an Informal Session, with Mr. Donato of Medford in the Chair (having been appointed by the Speaker, under authority conferred by Rule 5, to perform the duties of the Chair).

At the request of the Chair (Mr. Donato), the members and employees joined with him in reciting the pledge of allegiance to the flag.

Resolutions.

The following resolutions (filed with the Clerk) were referred, under Rule 85, to the committee on Rules:

Resolutions (filed by Mr. Cabral of New Bedford) congratulating the Bay State Band on the occasion of its one hundredth anniversary; and

Resolutions (filed by Representatives Capano of Lynn, Cahill of Lynn, Ehrlich of Marblehead and Wong of Saugus) congratulating the Lynn Yacht Club for its one hundred and fiftieth anniversary;

Mr. Galvin of Canton, for the committee on Rules, reported, in each instance, that the resolutions ought to be adopted. Under suspension of the rules, in each instance, on motion of Mr. Wong of Saugus, the resolutions (reported by the committee on Bills in the Third Reading to be correctly drawn) were considered forthwith; and they were adopted.

Paper from the Senate.

A petition (accompanied by bill) of Nick Collins for legislation to establish a sick leave bank for Natacha Grace, an employee of the Massachusetts Bay Transportation Authority, came from the Senate referred, under suspension of Joint Rule 12, to the committee on Public Service.

The House then concurred with the Senate in the suspension of said rule; and the petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 2967) was referred, in concurrence, to the committee on Public Service.
