From the Executive Office for Administration and Finance and the Executive Office for Housing and Livable Communities (see item 1599-0514 of Section 2 of Chapter 77 of the Acts of 2023 and Section 19 of Chapter 88 of the Acts of 2024) submitting the November 4, 2024 biweekly report on the emergency housing assistance program;

From the Executive Office of Housing and Livable Communities (see Section 15 of Chapter 150 of the Acts of 2024) submitting a report relative to delays of statutory deadlines in appeals before the Housing Appeals Committee (HAC); and

From the Middlesex Restoration Center Commission (see Section 225 of Chapter 69 of the Acts of 2018, as most recently amended by Section 142 of Chapter 126 of the Acts of 2022) submitting a report on the status of the development and implementation of a six-year plan to build a restoration center in the former county of Middlesex;

#### Petitions.

Representative Moran of Lawrence presented a petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 5098) of Frank A. Moran, Pavel Payano and Estela A. Reyes (with approval of the mayor and city council) relative to defining a governing structure for the Lawrence School Board upon the exit of state receivership; and the same was referred to the committee on Municipalities and Regional Government. Sent to the Senate for concurrence.

Representative Consalvo of Boston presented a petition (subject to Joint Rule 12) of Rob Consalvo (with the approval of the mayor and city council) relative to property tax classification in the city of Boston; and the same was referred, under Rule 24, to the committee on Rules.

Mr. Galvin of Canton, for the committee on Rules and the committees on Rules of the two branches, acting concurrently, then reported recommending that Joint Rule 12 be suspended. Under suspension of the rules, on motion of Mr. Consalvo, the report was considered forthwith. Joint Rule 12 was suspended; and the petition (accompanied by bill) was referred to the committee on Revenue. Sent to the Senate for concurrence.

Representative Robertson of Tewksbury presented a petition (subject to Joint Rule 12) of David Allen Robertson for legislation to establish a sick leave bank for Jeanne Rainone, an employee of the Department of Children and Families; and the same was referred, under Rule 24, to the committee on Rules.

### Paper from the Senate.

A Bill to increase housing production in the city of Lowell (Senate, No. 2977) (on Senate bill No. 2470), passed to be engrossed by the Senate, was read; and it was referred, under Rule 33, to the committee on Ways and Means.
