Thursday, July 10, 2025.

A message from Her Excellency the Governor returning with her disapproval of certain items and reductions in certain items, and also with recommendation of amendments of certain sections contained in the engrossed Bill making appropriations for the fiscal year 2026 for the maintenance of the departments, boards, commissions, institutions and certain activities of the Commonwealth, for interest, sinking fund and serial bond requirements, and for certain permanent improvements [see House, No. 4240] (for message, see House, No. 4250), filed in the office of the Clerk on Friday, July 4, was read.
