Met at six minutes past eleven o'clock A.M.

Petition.

Mr. Moore presented a petition (subject to Joint Rule 12) of Richard T. Moore, the Massachusetts Nurses Association, by Gloria Craven, Cele Hahn, Carol A. Donovan and other members of the General Court for legislation to designate a plaque for Clara Barton,— **and the same was referred, under Senate Rule 20, to the committees on Rules of the two branches, acting concurrently.**

Reports of Committees.

By Mr. Joyce, for the committee on Public Service, on Senate, Nos. 1223, 1225, 1227, 1241, 1255, 1260, 1261 and 1338, an Order relative to authorizing the joint committee on Public Service to make an investigation and study of various Senate documents relative to disability presumptions and retirement benefits and returning to work (Senate, No. 1790); and By the same Senator, for the same committee, on Senate, Nos. 235, 1216, 1217, 1265, 1266, 1307, 1339, 1343, 1354, 1362, 1364, 1366, 1367, 1373, 1374, 1379, 1383 and 1388, an Order relative to authorizing the joint committee on Public Service to make an investigation and study of various Senate documents relative to collective bargaining and binding arbitration (Senate, No. 1791); **Severally referred, under Joint Rule 29, to the committees on Rules of the two branches, acting concurrently.**

By Mr. Tolman, for the committee on Local Affairs, on petition, a Bill establishing the Scantic Valley Water District (Senate, No. 1724) [Local approval received];

By the same Senator, for the same committee, on petition, a Bill promoting the protection of Cider Mill Park in the city of Worcester by approving the conveyance of a conservation restriction to the Greater Worcester Land Trust, Inc. (Senate, No. 1739) [Local approval received]; and

By Mr. Joyce, for the committee on Public Service, on petition, a Bill exempting the position of deputy chief of police in the town of Milton from the provisions of the civil service laws (printed as House, No. 4143) [Local approval received]; **Severally read and, under Senate Rule 26, placed in the Orders of the Day for the next session.**

By Mr. Joyce, for the committee on Public Service, ought NOT to pass, on the petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 1353) of Bruce E. Tarr for legislation to permit public disclosure of certain collective bargaining proposals; **Referred, under Senate Rule 36, to the committee on Steering and Policy.**

Mr. Brewer, for the committee on Steering and Policy, reported that the following matter be placed in the Orders of the Day for the next session:

Petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 4311) of Anthony J. Verga that the city of Gloucester be authorized to convey certain park land for residential purposes;

Under suspension of Joint Rule 7B, to the committee on State Administration.
