Ordered, That by the authority of article IV of section II of chapter I of the Constitution, the Senate declares that, by reason of the resignation of Robert A. Durand as senator from the Middlesex and Worcester district, the office of senator from the Middlesex and Worcester district is vacant. By the authority of article XXIV of the Amendments to the Constitution, the Senate directs the President of the Senate to issue a precept setting forth April 13, 1999 as the day for holding an election to fill the vacancy in the

Middlesex and Worcester district, comprising the city of Marlborough and the towns of Acton, Ayer, Boxborough, Hudson, Littleton, Maynard, Shirley and Stow in the county of Middlesex; and the towns of Berlin, Harvard, Northborough and Southborough, and precincts 1, 2 and 4 of the town of Westborough, in the county of Worcester.
