Mr. Brewer, for the committee on Steering and Policy, reported that the following matters be placed in the Orders of the Day for the next session:

The House bills

Designating a certain exit ramp in the city of New Bedford as the Alvin Glaser Memorial Exit (House, No. 4966); and
Relative to the duties of escrow agents (House, No. 5002).

Communication.

A communication, received by the Clerk from the Office of the President, transmitting resolutions adopted by the Maine Legislature, of a Joint Resolution expressing support for a New England coalition on prescription drug prices (received on Friday, February 18, 2000),— **was placed on file.**

Committee Discharged.

Mr. Moore, for the committee on Health Care, reported, asking to be discharged from further consideration of the petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 2017) of William F. Galvin, Secretary of the Commonwealth, Richard T. Moore and Angelo M. Scaccia for legislation relative to annual service plan filings by health maintenance organizations and certain prescription price disclosures,— and recommending that the same be referred to the Senate committee on Ways and Means.

Under Senate Rule 36, the report was considered forthwith and accepted.
