Monday, March 20, 2000.

Met at two minutes past eleven o'clock A.M.

Distinguished Guests.

The President introduced the Everett High School Crimson Tide Football Team and cheerleading squad. The team is 1999 Division I Eastern Massachusetts Super Bowl Champions. Three of the team players were noted for their outstanding talent: Diamond Ferri was named Massachusetts Gatorade Player of the Year, and was named as an All-Scholastic by the Boston Herald and Boston Globe; David O'Brien was named All-Scholastic by the Boston Herald; and Jonathan DelGado was named All-Scholastic by the Boston Globe. The team was accompanied by Coach John DiBiaso and his wife, Maureen, who is the cheerleading coach. They were the guests of Senate President Birmingham.

PAPERS FROM THE HOUSE.

Order — Amended.

The following House Order (approved by the committees on Rules of the two branches, acting concurrently) was considered forthwith, as follows:

Ordered, That, notwithstanding the provisions of Joint Rule 10, the committee on Natural Resources and Agriculture be granted until Friday, March 17, 2000, the time within which to make its final report on current House document 1776, concerning the creation of the MWRA pipeline assistance program.

Pending the question on adoption of the order, an amendment, presented by Mr. Pacheco, adding at the end thereof the following: “and current Senate documents numbered 972, 1016, 1044 and 2112”; “and by striking out the date “March 17, 2000” and inserting in place thereof the date: “March 31, 2000”,— was considered; and it was adopted.

The order, as amended, was then adopted.

Sent to the House for concurrence in the amendment.

Engrossed Bills.

The following engrossed bills (both of which originated in the House), having been certified by the Senate Clerk to be rightly and truly prepared for final passage, were severally passed to be enacted and were signed by the President and laid before the Governor for his approbation, to wit:

Designating a certain bridge in the towns of Wareham and Bourne as the William Dalton memorial bridge (see House Bill, printed as Senate, No. 1693); and
Relative to the emergency medical services system (see House, No. 1946, amended).
