Met at four minutes past eleven o'clock A.M. (Ms. Melconian in the Chair) (having been appointed by the President, under authority conferred by Senate Rule 4, to perform the duties of the Chair).

PAPER FROM THE HOUSE.

Engrossed Bill.

An engrossed Bill authorizing the Trial Court to establish a sick leave bank for Roseanne Moore, an employee of the Trial Court (see Senate, No. 2188, amended) (which originated in the Senate), **having been certified by the Senate Clerk to be rightly and truly prepared for final passage, was passed to be enacted and was signed by the Acting President and laid before the Acting Governor for her approbation.**

Resolutions.

PAPER FROM THE HOUSE.

Emergency Preamble Adopted.

An engrossed Bill establishing Congressional districts (see House Bill, printed in House, No. 4778, Appendix A, amended), having been certified by the Senate Clerk to be rightly and truly prepared for final passage and containing an emergency preamble,— was laid before the Senate; and, a separate vote being taken in accordance with the requirements of Article LXVII of the Amendments to the Constitution, the preamble was adopted, in concurrence, by a vote of 7 to 0.

The bill was signed by the Acting President and sent to the House for enactment.
