Met according to adjournment at eleven o'clock A.M. (Mr. Rosenberg in the Chair).

The order was considered forthwith and adopted.

Mr. Moore presented the following order, to wit:

Ordered, That the Senate hereby calls for a joint session of the two Houses, conformably to the provisions of Article XLVIII (as amended by Article LXXXI) of the Amendments to the Constitution, to consider a proposal for a legislative amendment to the Constitution relative to emergency appointments of elected officials (see Senate, No. 355) with reference to which the committee on Election Laws has reported recommending said amendment ought NOT to pass.

The order was considered forthwith and adopted.

Mr. Knapik offered the following order, to wit:

Ordered, That the Senate hereby calls for a joint session of the two Houses, conformably to the provisions of Article XLVIII (as amended by Article LXXXI) of the Amendments to the Constitution, to consider a proposal for a legislative amendment to the Constitution promoting the representative character of ballot questions (see Senate, No. 362) with reference to which the committee on Election Laws has reported recommending said amendment ought NOT to pass (Senator Nuciforo dissenting). The order was considered forthwith and adopted.

Mr. Knapik offered the following order, to wit:

Ordered, That the Senate hereby calls for a joint session of the two Houses, conformably to the provisions of Article XLVIII (as amended by Article LXXXI) of the Amendments to the Constitution, to consider a proposal for a legislative amendment to the Constitution relative to the election of judges (see Senate, No. 1065) having been reported ought NOT to pass from the committee on the Judiciary (under Joint Rule 23), the time within which the committee was required to report having expired. The order was considered forthwith and adopted.

Messrs. Joyce and Hedlund presented the following order, to wit:

Ordered, That the Senate hereby calls for a joint session of the two Houses, conformably to the provisions of Article XLVIII (as amended by Article LXXXI) of the Amendments to the Constitution, to consider a proposal for a legislative amendment to the Constitution relative to abolish the Governor's Council (see Senate, No. 1984) having been reported ought NOT to pass from the committee on the Judiciary (under Joint Rule 23), the time within which the committee was required to report having expired. |
