There being no objection, at a half past one o'clock P.M., the President declared a recess subject to the call of the Chair; and, at twenty-four minutes past two o'clock P.M., the Senate reassembled, the President in the Chair.

PAPER FROM THE HOUSE.

A Bill relative to expanding the military mission at Hanscom Air Force Base and Soldier Systems Center — Natick(House, No. 2008, amended,— being a message from His Excellency the Governor),— was read.

There being no objection, the rules were suspended, on motion of Ms. Fargo, and the bill was read a second time.

Pending the question on ordering the bill to a third reading, Ms. Fargo moved the bill be amended by inserting after Section 5 (as printed) the following section:—

"SECTION 5A. MassDevelopment shall establish an advisory council of the municipal governments in which Hanscom and Natick are located, which shall consist of a representative, appointed by the executive body, from each of the towns of Bedford, Concord, Lexington, Lincoln and Natick. The advisory council shall receive quarterly progress updates on the project's development from MassDevelopment and shall offer comment on local concerns and considerations regarding the progress and development of the project."

The amendment was adopted.

The bill, as amended, was then ordered to a third reading, read a third time and passed to be engrossed, in concurrence, its title having been changed by the committee on Bills in the Third Reading to read as follows: An Act relative to expanding the military mission at Hanscom Air Force Base and the US Army Soldier Systems Center (Natick)". Sent to the House for concurrence in the amendment.

Recess.

There being no objection, at eighteen minutes before three o'clock P.M., the President declared a recess subject to the call of the Chair; and, at ten minutes past three o'clock P.M., the Senate reassembled, the President in the Chair.

PAPERS FROM THE HOUSE.

The House Bill relative to expanding the military mission at Hanscom Air Force Base and the US Army Soldier Systems Center (Natick) (House, No. 2008, amended),— came from the House with the endorsement that the House had NON-concurred in the Senate amendment inserting after section 5 (as printed) the following section:—

"SECTION 5A. MassDevelopment shall establish an advisory council of the municipal governments in which Hanscom and Natick are located, which shall consist of a representative, appointed by chief executive officer, from each of the towns of Bedford, Concord, Lexington, Lincoln, and Natick. The advisory council shall received quarterly progress updates on the project's development from MassDevelopment and shall offer comment on local concerns and considerations regarding the progress and development of the project."

On motion of Ms. Fargo, the Senate receded from its amendment.

Emergency Preamble Adopted.

An engrossed Bill relative to expanding the military mission at Hanscom Air Force Base and the US Army Soldier Systems Center (Natick) (see House, No. 2008, amended), having been certified by the Senate Clerk to be rightly and truly prepared for final passage and containing an emergency preamble,— was laid before the Senate; and, a separate vote being taken in accordance with the requirements of Article LXVII of the Amendments to the Constitution, the preamble was adopted in concurrence, by a vote of 9 to 0.

The bill was signed by the President and sent to the House for enactment.

Distinguished Guests.

There being no objection, the Chair (Ms. Walsh) (having been appointed by the President, under authority conferred by Senate Rule 4, to perform the duties of the Chair) introduced, seated in the Senate Gallery, Girl Scouts Troop 4412 from Scituate. They were the guests of Senator Hedlund.

Engrossed Bill — State Loan.
