### JOURNAL OF THE SENATE.

*Wednesday, March 16, 2005.*

Met at one minute past eleven o'clock A.M. (Mr. Hart in the Chair).

The Chair (Mr. Hart), members, guests and employees then recited the pledge of allegiance to the flag.

#### PAPERS FROM THE HOUSE.

Messages were referred, in concurrence, as follows:

Message from His Excellency the Governor recommending legislation relative to providing for the Massachusetts opportunity relocation and expansion jobs programs for the Commonwealth (House, No. 605);

**To the committee on Economic Development and Emerging Technologies.**

Message from His Excellency the Governor recommending legislation relative to making appropriations for the fiscal year 2005 to provide for supplementing certain existing appropriations and to promote, retain, and create jobs in Massachusetts (House, No. 603); and

Message from His Excellency the Governor recommending legislation relative to further creating and protecting jobs, easing the unemployment insurance burden on employers, and preserving the solvency of the trust fund (House, No. 604);
