Thursday, January 24, 2008.

Met at two minutes past eleven o'clock A.M. (Mr. Tolman in the Chair) (having been appointed by the President, under authority conferred by Senate Rule 4, to perform the duties of the Chair).

The Senate commends you for your outstanding commitment to human rights around the world and the elimination of land mines worldwide. We also welcome and applaud human rights advocate Abraham Gebreyesus, who at the age of 11 survived a land mine explosion in the fields of his small village town in Eritrea.
