Met according to adjournment at eleven o'clock A.M. (Mr. Havern in the Chair).

The Chair (Mr. Havern), members, guests and employees then recited the pledge of allegiance to the flag.

Distinguished Guests.

There being no objection, the Chair (Mr. Havern) handed the gavel to Mr. Hedlund for the purposes of an introduction. Mr. Hedlund then introduced, in French, students from the Quebec province in Canada who were touring the State House.

Communication from the Department of Public Health relative to a plan of correction submitted pursuant to inspection of the Middlesex County House of Correction and Jail (received Thursday, February 22, 2007);

Executive Reorganization Plan No. 1 of 2007.
