### JOURNAL OF THE SENATE.

*Thursday, May 29, 2008.*

Met at four minutes past eleven o'clock A.M. (Mr. Tolman in the Chair) (having been appointed by the President, under authority conferred by Senate Rule 4, to perform the duties of the Chair).

The Chair (Mr. Tolman), members, guests and employees then recited the pledge of allegiance to the flag.

Petitions.

Ms. Menard presented a petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 2722) of Joan M. Menard, Michael J. Rodrigues and Kevin Aguiar (with the approval of the Mayor and City Council) for legislation relative to the appointment and status of the Fire Chief and the Board of Fire Commissioners in the city of Fall River [Local approval received],— **and the same was referred, under Senate Rule 20, to the committee on Municipalities and Regional Government. Sent to the House for concurrence.**

Mr. Timilty presented a petition (subject to Joint Rule 9) of James E. Timilty, John H. Rogers, Louis L. Kafka and Richard J. Ross (by vote of the town) for legislation to establish the Walpole Economic Development and Industrial Corporation,— **and the same was transmitted, under the provisions of Section 5 of Chapter 3 of the General Laws, to the Secretary of State.**

*Adjournment in Memory of Antone L Silva.*

The Senator from Bristol and Plymouth, Mr. Montigny, requested that when the Senate adjourns today, it adjourn in memory of former Senator Antone “Tony” L. Silva.

Former Senator Antone “Tony” Silva passed away on May 16, 2008. Senator Silva represented New Bedford and Dartmouth in the Massachusetts Senate in the early 1960's and prior to that he was in the Massachusetts House of Representatives. In 1965 he was appointed Postmaster in the New Bedford area where he served for 25 years.

Accordingly, as a mark of respect to the memory of Antone L. Silva, at eighteen minutes past eleven o'clock A.M., on motion of Mr. Knapik, the Senate adjourned to meet again Monday next at eleven o'clock A.M.
