JOURNAL OF THE SENATE.

Thursday, July 23, 2009.

Met at one minute past eleven o'clock A.M. (Mr. Rosenberg in the Chair).

The Senator from Plymouth and Norfolk, Mr. Hedlund, then led the Chair (Mr. Rosenberg), members, guests and employees in the recitation of the pledge of allegiance to the flag.

Distinguished Guests.

There being no objection, Mr. Rosenberg introduced, seated in the Gallery, a group from the Shelburne Community Center in Boston. The Shelburne Center is a collaborative community computer technology center working together to help the residents of Roxbury, Massachusetts and its surrounding neighborhoods to build the technological skills, confidence and knowledge required to be successful in the information economy.

Reports of a Committee
