### JOURNAL OF THE SENATE.

*Friday, September 18, 2009.*

Met at six minutes past twelve o'clock noon (Mr. Petrucci in the Chair).

#### *Reports of a Committee*

By Ms. Flanagan, for the committee on Mental Health and Substance Abuse, on petition, a Bill relative to juvenile mental health (Senate, No. 733);

By the same Senator, for the same committee, on petition, a Bill to authorize the Department of Mental Health to establish teen drop in centers (Senate, No. 740);

By the same Senator, for the same committee, on petition, a Bill to provide for a study of the central intake for the placement of substance abusers in treatment facilities (Senate, No. 750);

By the same Senator, for the same committee, on petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 751), a Bill providing for a study of sober homes (Senate No. 2155); and

By the same Senator, for the same committee, on Senate, No. 757 and House, No. 3586, a Bill for coordination of children's mental health clinicians Senate, No. 2156);
