Met at three minutes past eleven o'clock A.M. (Mr. Donnelly in the Chair).

The Chair (Mr. Donnelly), members, guests and employees then recited the pledge of allegiance to the flag.

#### Communication.

A communication from the Public Employee Retirement Commission (under the provisions of Section 50 of Chapter 7 of the General Laws) submitting recommended amendments to the rules and regulations governing retirement of public employees in the Commonwealth (Senate, No. 2646) (received Thursday, October 21, 2010),— was referred to the committee on Public Service.

Sent to the House for concurrence.

## Report of a Committee.

By Mr. Montigny, for the committee on Bonding, Capital Expenditures and State Assets, that the Senate Bill providing for the disposition of state owned land in the city of Boston (Senate, No. 2612),-- ought to pass, with an amendment substituting a new draft with the same title (Senate, No. 2645);

Referred, under Senate Rule 27, to the committee on Ways and Means.

### Committees Discharged.

Mr. Berry, for the committees on Rules of the two branches, acting concurrently, reported, asking to be discharged from further consideration of the Senate Order relative to authorizing the joint committee on Health Care Financing to make an investigation and study of certain current Senate documents relative to health care finance (Senate, No. 2643),-- and recommending that the same be referred to the Senate committee on Ethics and Rules.

Under Senate Rule 36, the report was considered forthwith and accepted.

## PAPERS FROM THE HOUSE

A Bill relative to Title V approval (House, No. 751,-- on petition),-- was read and, under Senate Rule 26, referred to the committee on Ethics and Rules.

A Bill authorizing the town of Rehoboth to grant an additional license for the sale of all alcoholic beverages not to be drunk on the premises (House, No. 4847,-- on petition) [Local approval received],-- was read and, under Senate Rule 26, placed in the Orders of the Day for the next session.

The following resolutions (having been filed with the Clerk) were considered forthwith and adopted, as follows: Resolutions (filed by Ms. Murray) "honoring Paul D. Brodeur on the occasion of his retirement from the Falmouth Fire Rescue Department."
