Tuesday, April 3, 2012.

Met at five minutes past eleven o'clock A.M. (Mr. Donnelly in the Chair).

The Chair (Mr. Donnelly), members, guests and staff then recited the pledge of allegiance to the flag.

Communication.

A communication from the Executive Office for Administration and Finance, Human Resources Division (under the provisions of Section 25 of Chapter 31 of the General Laws) submitting notice of revocation of certain public safety fire promotional lists (received Tuesday, April 2, 2012),—was placed on file.

Reports of Committees.

By Mr. Kennedy, for the committee on Consumer Protection and Professional Licensure, on petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 83), a Bill relative to sustainable water conservation practices (Senate, No. 2201); By the same Senator, for the same committee, on petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 125), a Bill relative to mobile spas (Senate, No. 2202);

Report of a Committee.

The committee bill was read.

Order Adopted.

Mr. Brewer offered the following order, to wit:

Ordered, That notwithstanding Senate Rule 7 or any other rule to the contrary, the Committee Bill relative to the right to repair (Senate, No. 2204), reported from the committee on Ways and Means, shall be placed in the Orders of the Day for a second reading on Thursday, April 5, 2012.

All amendments shall be filed electronically in the office of the Clerk of the Senate by 12:00 noon, on Wednesday, April 4, 2012. All such amendments shall be second-reading amendments to the Ways and Means Committee bill (Senate, No. 2204). The Clerk shall further specify the procedure and format for filing all amendments, consistent with this order.

After the bill as amended is ordered to a third reading, it shall immediately be read a third time and the question shall then immediately be on passing it to be engrossed, and no amendments shall be in order at the third reading of the bill unless recommended by the committee on Bills in the Third Reading.

Under the rules, referred to the committee on Ethics and Rules.

Subsequently, Mr. Berry, for the said committee, reported, recommending that the order ought to be adopted. The rules were suspended, on motion of Mr. Tarr, and the order was considered forthwith and adopted. The bill (Senate, No. 2204) was then placed in the Orders of the Day for a second reading for Thursday, April 5, 2012.

Report of Committees.
