JOURNAL OF THE SENATE.

Monday, May 14, 2012.

Met at three minutes past eleven o'clock A.M. (Mr. Donnelly in the Chair) (having been appointed by the President, under authority conferred by Senate Rule 4, to perform the duties of the Chair).

The Chair (Mr. Donnelly), members, guests and staff then recited the pledge of allegiance to the flag.

Reports of Committees.

By Mr. Richard T. Moore, for the committee on Health Care Financing, that the recommitted Senate Bill establishing a board of registration in naturopathy (Senate, No 1158),-- ought to pass [Estimated cost – more than \$100,000];

Referred, under Senate Rule 27, to the committee on Ways and Means.

By Mr. Pacheco, for the committee on Environment, Natural Resources and Agriculture, on Senate, Nos. 325, 332, 334, 338, 342, 345, 354, 356, 363, 372, 373, 374, 377, 378 and 381, an Order relative to authorizing the joint committee on Environment, Natural Resources and Agriculture to make an investigation and study of certain current Senate documents relative to agriculture, forestry and other land issues (Senate, No. 2259);

Referred, under Joint Rule 29, to the committees on Rules of the two branches, acting concurrently.

Committees Discharged.

Mr. Berry, for the committees on Rules of the two branches, acting concurrently, reported, asking to be discharged from further consideration of the Senate Order relative to authorizing the joint committee on Environment, Natural Resources and Agriculture to make an investigation and study of certain current Senate documents relative to hazardous waste, waste management and other waste issues (Senate, No. 2258),-- **and recommending that the same be referred to the Senate committee on Ethics and Rules.**

Under Senate Rule 36, the report was considered forthwith and accepted.
