Friday, July 8, 2011.

Met at six minutes past eleven o'clock A.M. (Mr. Tolman in the Chair).

The Chair (Mr. Tolman), members, guests and employees then recited the pledge of allegiance to the flag.

Petition.

Mr. Rosenberg presented a petition (accompanied by bill, Senate No. 1959) of Stanley C. Rosenberg and Paul Marks (by vote of the town) for legislation to provide for recall elections in the town of Northfield [Local approval received];

Referred, under Senate Rule 20, to the committee on Election Laws.

Sent to House for concurrence.
