JOURNAL OF THE SENATE.

Thursday, November 13, 2014.

Met at six minutes past eleven o'clock A.M. (Mr. Petrucci in the Chair) (having been appointed by the President, under authority conferred by Senate Rule 4, to perform the duties of the Chair).

The Chair (Mr. Petrucci), members, guests and staff then recited the pledge of allegiance to the flag.

Communications.

The following communications were severally received and placed on file:

Communication from the Honorable Barry R. Finegold, Senate Chairman of the Joint Committee on Election Laws, announcing the appointment of Pamela Wilmot, Executive Director of Common Cause Massachusetts, as the designated representative of the election laws advocacy community designated by the Senate and House Chairs of the joint committee on election laws (pursuant to Section 29 of Chapter 210 of the Acts of 2014) to the campaign finance and disclosure task force; and
Communication from the Honorable Bruce E. Tarr, Senate Minority Leader, announcing the appointment Jeffrey Yull of North Reading as his designated representative (pursuant to Section 29 of Chapter 210 of the Acts of 2014) to the campaign finance and disclosure task force.

Petitions.

Petitions were severally presented and referred as follows:

By Ms. Flanagan, a petition (subject to Joint Rule 12) of Jennifer L. Flanagan and Dennis A. Rosa for legislation to establish a sick leave bank for Ellen Carlson, an employee of the Department of Developmental Services; and
By Mr. Timilty, a petition (subject to Joint Rule 12) of James E. Timilty, Louis L. Kafka, F. Jay Barrows and Elizabeth A. Poirier for legislation to establish a sick leave bank for Eileen Bazinet, an employee of the Massachusetts Rehabilitation Commission;
Severally, under Senate Rule 20, to the committees on Rules of the two branches, acting concurrently.

Report of a Committee.

By Mr. Finegold, for the committee on Election Laws, on petition, a Bill relative to discontinuing the fluoride supplementation of the Rockport water supply (Senate, No. 2388) [Local approval received];
Read and, under Senate Rule 26, placed in the Orders of the Day for the next session.

Petitions were severally referred, in concurrence, as follows:

Petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 4528) of Joseph F. Wagner and others (with the approval of the mayor and city council) that the city of Chicopee be authorized to amend the charter of said city;
To the committee on Municipalities and Regional Government.

Petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 4529) of Daniel Hunt and others (with the approval of the mayor and city council) that the city of Boston be authorized to use retired Boston police officers for certain details in said city;

To the committee on Public Service.

Recess.

There being no objection, at eighteen minutes past eleven o'clock A.M., the Chair (Mr. Petrucci) declared a recess subject to the call of the Chair; and, at twelve minutes past twelve o'clock noon, the Senate reassembled, Mr. Petrucci in the Chair.

Resolutions.

The following resolutions (having been filed with the Clerk) were severally considered forthwith and adopted, as follows:- Resolutions (filed by Mr. Hedlund) "congratulating Ryan Robert Ahearn on his elevation to the rank of Eagle Scout"; Resolutions (filed by Mr. Hedlund) "congratulating Paul Bonarrigo on his elevation to the rank of Eagle Scout"; and Resolutions (filed by Mr. Pacheco) "congratulating the Reverend Sharon Lunsford on her appointment as Senior Pastor of the Antioch Church in the city of Taunton."

Matter Taken Out of the Orders of the Day.

There being no objection, the following matter was taken out of the Orders the Day and considered as follows:

The Senate Bill authorizing the city of Salem to grant 1 additional liquor license for the sale of wine and malt beverages not to be drunk on the premises (Senate, No. 2376),-- **was read a second time and ordered to a third reading.**

Reports of Committees.

Mr. Rosenberg, for the committee on Ethics and Rules, reported that the following matter be placed in the Orders of the Day for the next session:

The House Bill relative to hospital indemnity insurance policies (House, No. 3730) (the committee on Ethics and Rules recommending that the bill be amended by striking out all after the enacting clause and inserting in place thereof the text of Senate document numbered 2395)

There being no objection, the rules were suspended, on motion of Mr. Tarr, and the bill was read a second time and was amended, as recommended by the committee on Ethics and Rules.

The bill, as amended, was then ordered to a third reading, read a third time and passed to be engrossed, in concurrence, with the amendment.

Sent to the House for concurrence in the amendment.

PAPERS FROM THE HOUSE

Emergency Preamble Adopted.

An engrossed Bill establishing a sick leave bank for Stephanie Deronette, an employee of the Executive Office of Health and Human Services (see House, No. 4506), having been certified by the Senate Clerk to be rightly and truly prepared for final passage and containing an emergency preamble,-- **was laid before the Senate; and, a separate vote being taken in accordance with the requirements of Article LXVII of the Amendments to the Constitution, the preamble was adopted in concurrence, by a vote of 2 to 0.**

The bill was signed by the Acting President (Mr. Petrucci) and sent to the House for enactment.

Engrossed Bills.

The following engrossed bills (the first of which originated in the Senate), having been certified by the Senate Clerk to be rightly and truly prepared for final passage, were severally passed to be enacted and were signed by the Acting President (Mr. Petrucci) and laid before the Governor for his approbation, to wit:

Relative to the Department of Inspectional Services in the city of Lynn (see Senate, No. 2276); and

Relative to the Middleton town charter (see House, No. 4451, amended).

Order Adopted.
