Matters Taken Out of the Orders of the Day.

There being no objection, the following matters were taken out of the Orders of the Day and considered as follows: The Senate Bill exempting part-time call firefighters in the town of Athol from the civil service law (Senate, No. 1930),-- was read a second time, ordered to a third reading, read a third time and passed to be engrossed. Sent to the House for concurrence.

The House Bill eliminating the board of public works of the town of Acushnet (House, No. 3834),-- was read a third time and passed to be engrossed, in concurrence.

## PAPERS FROM THE HOUSE.

A petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 3922) of F. Jay Barrows, Louis L. Kafka and Elizabeth A. Poirier for legislation to designate a certain underpass in the town of Mansfield as the patrolman Walter P. Langley memorial underpass, -- was referred, in concurrence, under suspension of Joint Rule 12, to the committee on Transportation.

Emergency Preambles Adopted.

An engrossed Bill establishing a sick leave bank for Margaret C. Henderson, an employee of the Executive Office of Health and Human Services (see House, No. 45), having been certified by the Senate Clerk to be rightly and truly prepared for final passage and containing an emergency preamble,-- was laid before the Senate; and, a separate vote being taken in accordance with the requirements of Article LXVII of the Amendments to the Constitution, the preamble was adopted in concurrence, by a vote of 2 to 0.

The bill was signed by the Acting President (Mr. McGee) and sent to the House for enactment.

An engrossed Bill relative to the terms of certain bonds to be issued by the Commonwealth (see House Bill, printed in House, No. 3880), having been certified by the Senate Clerk to be rightly and truly prepared for final passage and containing an emergency preamble,-- was laid before the Senate; and, a separate vote being taken in accordance with the requirements of Article LXVII of the Amendments to the Constitution, the preamble was adopted in concurrence, by a vote of 2 to 0. The bill was signed by the Acting President (Mr. McGee) and sent to the House for enactment.

Engrossed Bills.

The following engrossed bills (the first of which originated in the Senate), having been certified by the Senate Clerk to be rightly and truly prepared for final passage, were severally passed to be enacted and were signed by the Acting President (Mr. McGee) and laid before the Governor for his approbation, to wit:

Authorizing the town of Arlington to establish a special account for the purchase, installation and maintenance of public works of art (see Senate, No. 1794);

Establishing a sick leave bank for Margaret C. Henderson, an employee of the Executive Office of Health and Human Services (see House, No. 45); and

Relative to the terms of certain bonds to be issued by the Commonwealth (see House Bill, printed in House, No. 3880).
