Met at seven minutes past eleven o'clock A.M. (Mr. Richard T. Moore in the Chair)

Distinguished Guests.

There being no objection, the President handed the gavel to Mr. Rodrigues and Ms. Creem. They introduced, in the rear of the Chamber, members of the Hatikvah Officers Mission. This group is a project of the Combined's Jewish Philanthropies Boston-Haifa Connection which brings young, active duty IDF Officers from Haifa to Boston to talk about their Israeli identity and experiences in the Israeli military. The group included members from Israeli-Ethiopian and Israeli-Russian communities. The Senate welcomed them with applause and they withdrew from the Chamber.

Report of a Committee.

By Mr. DiDomenico, for the committee on Municipalities and Regional Government, on petition, a Bill to establish the Worcester County Commission on the Status of Women (Senate, No. 927);

Read and, under Senate Rule 27, referred to the committee on Ways and Means.

PAPERS FROM THE HOUSE.

Reports

Of the committee on the Judiciary, asking to be discharged from further consideration of the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1511) of Deborah Raptopoulos, Med, MSW, LICSW for legislation to reform foster care services for children with regards to best interest representation,-- **and recommending that the same be referred to the committee on Children, Families and Persons with Disabilities;**

Of the committee on Revenue, asking to be discharged from further consideration

Of the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 2513) of John J. Binienda and Michael O. Moore for legislation to establish a municipal recycling enhancement fund from certain grants and revenue provided from unclaimed beverage container deposits; and

Of the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 2741) of Frank I. Smizik and others for legislation to establish an oil heat energy efficiency fund from an additional assessment on home heating oil;

And recommending that the same be severally referred to the committee on Telecommunications, Utilities and Energy; Were severally considered forthwith, under Senate Rule 36, and accepted, in concurrence.

There being no objection, at eight minutes past eleven o'clock A.M., the Chair (Mr. Richard T. Moore) declared a recess subject to the call of the Chair; and, at twenty minutes before twelve o'clock noon, the Senate reassembled, the President in the Chair.

The President, members, guests and staff then recited the pledge of allegiance to the flag.

Orders of the Day.

The Orders of the Day were considered as follows:

The Senate order setting forth certain procedures to be followed with reference to the House Bill relative to transportation finance (House, No. 3415) with the pending Ways and Means new text (Senate, No. 1766),-- **was considered, the main question being on adoption.**

Pending the question on adoption of the order, Mr. Brewer moves that the order be amended by striking out the first and second paragraphs and inserting in place there of the following paragraph:--

Ordered, That notwithstanding Senate Rule 7 or any other rule to the contrary, all amendments to the pending Ways and Means Ways and Means new text (Senate, No. 1766) to the House Bill relative to transportation finance (House, No. 3415) shall be filed electronically in the office of the Clerk of the Senate by 5:00 P.M. on Friday, April 12, 2013 or twenty-four hours after adoption of this order, whichever time is longer, and all amendment titles shall be printed in the Calendar. All such amendments shall be second-reading amendments to the proposed Ways and Means new text (Senate, No. 1766) but further amendments in the third degree to such amendments shall be in order. The Clerk shall further specify the procedure and format for filing all amendments, consistent with this order.

The amendment was adopted.

The order, as amended was then adopted.

Engrossed Bill—Land Taking for Conservation Etc.

An engrossed Bill authorizing the city of Springfield to convey certain park land and to grant a license agreement over certain park land to Unifirst Corporation (see House, No. 58) (which originated in the House), having been certified by the Senate Clerk to be rightly and truly prepared for final passage,-- was put upon its final passage; and, this being a bill providing for the taking of land or other easements used for conservation purposes, etc., as defined by Article XCVII of the Amendments to the Constitution, the question on passing it to be enacted was determined by a call of the yeas and nays, at one minute past twelve o'clock noon, as follows, to wit (*yeas 35 - nays 0*) [**Yeas and Nays No. 18**]:
