JOURNAL OF THE SENATE.

Monday, July 14, 2014.

Met at seven minutes past eleven o'clock A.M. (Mr. Petrucci in the Chair)

The Chair (Mr. Petrucci), members, guests and staff then recited the pledge of allegiance to the flag.

Report.

Report of the Massachusetts District Attorneys Association (pursuant to item 0340-2100 of Chapter 38 of the Acts of 2013) submitting a report detailing the District Attorneys' utilization of drug forfeiture funds collected pursuant to Chapter 94C of the General Laws,-- **was placed on file.**

Petition.

Ms. Chandler presented a petition (subject to Joint Rule 12) of Harriette L. Chandler for legislation to promote public safety and to protect access to reproductive health care facilities,-- **and the same was referred, under Senate Rule 20, to the committees on Rules of the two branches, acting concurrently.**

Resolutions.

The following resolutions (having been filed with the Clerk) were severally considered forthwith and adopted, as follows:- Resolutions (filed by Messrs. Lewis, Brewer and Brownsberger, Ms. Candaras, Ms. Chandler, Ms. Chang-Díaz, Mr. Eldridge, Ms. Forry, Messrs. McGee, Michael O. Moore and Richard T. Moore, Ms. O'Connor Ives, Mr. Rosenberg, Ms. Spilka and Mr. Wolf) "commending the Nelson Mandela Foundation on its observance of July 18, 2014 as Nelson Mandela Day."

Reports of a Committee.

By Mr. Brewer for the committee on Ways and Means, that the House Bill establishing a sick leave bank for Lana A. Soricelli, an employee of the Executive Office of Administration and Finance (House, No. 4202),-- ought to pass, with an amendment striking out, in lines 3, 6 and 10, the word "executive", each time it appears; striking out, in line 5, the words "Joseph Anthony Soricelli"; and striking out, in lines 8 and 9, the words "of Lana A. Soricelli's son".

There being no objection, the rules were suspended, on motion of Mr. Tarr, and the bill was read a second time and was amended, as recommended by the committee on Ways and Means.

The bill, as amended, was the ordered to a third reading, read a third time and passed to be engrossed, in concurrence, with the amendment.

Sent to the House for concurrence, in the amendment.

By Mr. Brewer for the committee on Ways and Means, that the House Bill relative to the reduction of gun violence (House, No. 4285),-- ought to pass, with an amendment striking out all after the enacting clause and inserting in place thereof the text of Senate document numbered 2265.

Order Adopted.

Mr. Brewer offered the following order, to wit:

Ordered, That notwithstanding Senate Rule 7 or any other rule to the contrary, the House Bill relative to the reduction of gun violence (House, No. 4285) (the committee on Ways and Means having recommended that bill be amended by striking out all after the enacting clause and inserting in place thereof the text of Senate document numbered 2265) shall be placed in the Orders of the Day for a second reading on Thursday, July 17, 2014.

All amendments shall be filed electronically in the office of the Clerk of the Senate by 5:00 P.M. tomorrow, Tuesday, July 15, 2014. All such amendments shall be second-reading amendments to the recommended Senate Ways and Means new text (Senate, No. 2265) but further amendments in the third degree to such amendments shall be in order. The Clerk shall further specify the procedure and format for filing all amendments, consistent with this order.

After the bill as amended is ordered to a third reading, it shall immediately be read a third time and the question shall then immediately be on passing it to be engrossed, and no amendments shall be in order at the third reading of the bill unless recommended by the committee on Bills in the Third Reading.

Under the rules, referred to the committee on Ethics and Rules.

Subsequently, Mr. Rosenberg, for the said committee, reported, recommending that the order ought to be adopted.

The rules were suspended, on motion of Mr. Tarr, and the order was considered forthwith and adopted.

The bill (House, No. 4285) was then placed in the Orders of the Day for a second reading on Thursday, July 17, with the Ways and Means new text (Senate, No. 2265) pending.

Recess.

There being no objection, at twenty-four minutes past eleven o'clock A.M., the Chair (Mr. Petruccelli) declared a recess subject to the call of the Chair; and, at a quarter before twelve o'clock noon, the Senate reassembled, Ms. Jehlen in the Chair (having been appointed by the President, under authority conferred by Senate Rule 4, to perform the duties of the Chair).

PAPERS FROM THE HOUSE
Emergency Preambles Adopted.

An engrossed Bill relative to proof of identity for certain licensure (see House, No. 3946, amended), having been certified by the Senate Clerk to be rightly and truly prepared for final passage and containing an emergency preamble,-- was laid before the Senate; and, a separate vote being taken in accordance with the requirements of Article LXVII of the Amendments to the Constitution, the preamble was adopted in concurrence, by a vote of 2 to 0.

The bill was signed by the Acting President (Ms. Jehlen) and sent to the House for enactment.

An engrossed Bill establishing a sick leave bank for Mariange Robert, an employee of the Department of Correction (see House, No. 4203, amended), having been certified by the Senate Clerk to be rightly and truly prepared for final passage and containing an emergency preamble,-- was laid before the Senate; and, a separate vote being taken in accordance with the requirements of Article LXVII of the Amendments to the Constitution, the preamble was adopted in concurrence, by a vote of 2 to 0.

The bill was signed by the Acting President (Ms. Jehlen) and sent to the House for enactment.

Engrossed Bill.

An engrossed Bill further regulating flood insurance (see House, No. 3783, amended) (which originated in the House), **having been certified by the Senate Clerk to be rightly and truly prepared for final passage, was passed to be enacted and signed by the Acting President (Ms. Jehlen) and laid before the Governor for his approbation.**

Order Adopted.

On motion of Mr. Tarr,--

Ordered, That when the Senate adjourns today, it adjourn to meet again tomorrow at one o'clock P.M., in a full formal session with a calendar.
